400 miles north of Cairns lies Raine Island, the world's largest green turtle rookery and placed amidst pristine reefs teaming with life. Explore this rarely visited sector of the Far Northern Great Barrier Reef.

Ribbon Reefs – Buddy up with diver sized fish at the Cod Hole. Find turtles & sea snakes at the Snake Pit.

Far Northern Reefs – Tijou, Cat, Creech, Erehwon & Aladdin's Cave. The upwelling currents attract schooling pelagics. Mantas, mobula & eagle rays cruise the Continental Shelf.

Great Detached Reef – Renowned soft corals, fans and whips at Twin Peaks, Oh My Bommie, Cracker. Big Woody & Epic. This reef is home to masses of marine life, large & small.

Stanley Island - Incredible indigenous rock art featuring turtles, eagle rays and crocodiles as well as ancient tall ships from the 16th Century. The world's longest art movement has spanned for thousands of years and you have the opportunity to see this pristine, rarely visited piece of important indigenous history.

Raine Island – World's largest green turtle rookery. Up to 100,000 green turtles visit each year to lay their eggs in the warm sands. Tiger sharks are attracted to the nesting turtles.

Pandora Wreck – 1871, sank with loss of 34 crew & mutineers from HMS Bounty. A dive into history like no other!
